As we begin a new form of normal in 2022, we must use the lessons we learned in the past year while in a global pandemic as a steppingstone going forward into our future. Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture committed itself to continuing events and programming by shifting to a virtual world while always thinking long-term. Our mission statement remained in our heads as we not just survived but thrived.

We began 2020 with a major pivot that created new virtual shows the entire community could enjoy. Programs such as, Artist’s Alchemy, All About the Arts Talk Show, Solo Sessions and Open Mic with Tom Galvin, Poetry Square with Diane Funston, Poetry Hour: Notes from the Field

with Marcelo Hernandez Castillo and many others allowed for ongoing engagement!

Many of our well-known programs like Applause! Applause! Kids, Poetry Out Loud and Scholastic Art & Writing moved into a virtual format as well. The arts become the saving grace for many within our community as we went into quarantine. The local youth were a huge priority for us with Arts in Education programs Poetry Out Loud and Scholastic Art & Writing continuing and leading to a record number of submissions.

We also took the time to restructure and renew our future goals as an organization. The creation of our own Racial Equity Statement went a long way toward giving us a foundation to ensure more equitable standards in the creation and running of events and programs. This statement solidifies our dedication to celebrating diversity in our community and guaranteeing a space at the table for the groups and

individuals who have been historically marginalized and oppressed.

Although there are many events that were missed greatly last year, this year is quickly becoming the brightest chapter in our story as an organization. The big news for this year is the Sutter Performing Arts Association transferring ownership of the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts to Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture.

The possibilities as we begin 2022 are endless. For all we have missed, we get something in return; a center for the arts for all in the Yuba-Sutter community. A place for all of us to gather and begin anew.

As we continue making strides forward, we hope that the community that has endlessly supported us continues to see the value in what we do. As a non-profit organization, we rely on our members, sponsors and supporters to see us through challenging times and through times of growth.

Thank you to our supporters for helping us make a difference in our community! Everything we do is a joint effort that requires each person to assist for success and we are grateful to have you all join us in our work.

From the Executive Director

What a time it has been! Starting in 2020 and on into 2021, we all had our lives turned upside down by COVID-19. Everything stopped in March 2020 when state ordered closures shut down our art galleries and theater. It broke our hearts to have to close just prior to the opening reception for the Yuba City High School art show right after all the student work had been carefully curated. Big sigh!

Because of the pandemic, we held off producing a 2019-2020 Annual Report based on all the uncertainty and offer this two-year report instead. It was nip and tuck for a while, but we found new revenue sources, received a variety of relief grants, and even received a grant that we re-granted to help local arts and culture organizations during these hard times.

But out of the pandemic ashes have risen many positive things. We looked around in April 2020 and asked ourselves what we could do to stay relevant and engage with the public in new and different ways despite restrictions on live events. We decided early on to go virtual and poured our hearts and souls into creating a whole new world of programming. We looked out over the arts and culture landscape and borrowed some ideas and invented a few new programs of our own.

You will read more about what we did elsewhere in this report, but here are some highlights. "All About the Arts" went from being a weekly radio talk show to a bi-weekly program streamed live on Facebook and our YouTube Channel. We created "Community Conversations" featuring local leaders speaking on a variety of topics ranging from the importance of public art to women in leadership positions in our community. "Artist's Alchemy" focuses on one-on-one interviews with local and national artists weighing in on their histories and current work in progress.

Core programs like Poetry Out Loud, Scholastic Art & Writing Awards and the Congressional Art Competition carried on albeit in a virtual world. We made up for the lack of monthly gallery shows and openings with a series of online art auctions which helped artists sell some of their art even during the pandemic.

Our Applause Kids! performing arts program continued and we produced youth musicals including "Super Happy Awesome News" and "Should You Hug a Cactus." Our full production of "Songs for A New World" introduced many audience members to the work of Jason Robert Brown with this beautiful and deeply moving musical.

We even painted a couple of new murals including "Coming to America" on the wall adjacent to the Buddhist Church in Marysville and "Then and Now" on the side of the AT&T building in Live Oak.

Our board adopted a racial equity statement and an accessibility policy. We created a land acknowledgement in honor of pre-colonization native cultures which we read before our public events. And our new bylaws are under development which will help us move forward and grow considering the massive growth and change our organization has experienced these past few years.

And perhaps the biggest news of all in this, our 40th anniversary year, has been the donation to us of the Sutter Theater, now named the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts, by the Sutter Performing Arts Association. The 150 seat "black box" theater is ready for prime time with a totally reimagined lobby with concession stand, new restrooms, full bar, and the Theater Gallery.



The good news is that despite the pandemic, the arts and culture are alive and well in Yuba-Sutter, and we all have so much more to look forward to in the years ahead. Come out to live events whenever you can and show your support. Purchase a ticket, buy a membership, sponsor an event, or even buy a seat or a star! Support the work at any level within your means. We are truly grateful for your support and look forward to sharing yet another year of looking for ways that our organization can help to "change the way you think about art."

Once Upon a Time...

Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture was the inspiration of a devoted artist and arts leader, Lee Burrows. Lee's labor of love – what would become one of the highest-ranking regional arts councils in California – began in a small office beneath the stairs of City Hall in Marysville back in 1981. In the mid-90s, along with a handful of local artists and business owners, Lee purchased an old church with a stage, a courtyard and garden, two small offices, and a meeting room on E Street in Marysville. E Street is known now as Marysville's 'gateway.' Lee's old church, with its garden and its recently refurbished offices is now the Lee Burrows Center for the Arts at Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture.

Where we are

The Yuba-Sutter Area rests in the Central Valley of California, north of the state capital of Sacramento, and banks the east and west sides of the Feather River which separates them. Yuba County lies along the western slope of the Sierra Nevada, while Sutter County flanks the Sacramento River in the Sacramento Valley and is home to the Sutter Buttes, "the world's smallest mountain range".

While agricultural life dominates our area, the Arts are a significant focal point for the future economic development of the region, particularly through their engagement in otherwise underserved rural areas and in partnership with both counties through an emerging public art strategy and increased programming. Home to about 180,000, Yuba-Sutter enjoys great cultural diversity with a Latinx, Asian, Black, Indigenous and People of Color and LGBTQIA+ populations.

What we do

Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture provides arts programming and advocacy for the bi-county Yuba-Sutter Area. Our mission is to enrich the quality of

life of our residents through participation and effective arts development. We host exhibitions, workshops, musical programs, theatre productions, literary events and lectures, along with a wide variety of community functions on behalf of the artists and arts organizations we support. Off-site we run diverse outreach and education programs that penetrate deep into our underserved areas.

Our Strategic priorities

- To build sustainable and equitable arts programs which create impact and meaning
- To provide opportunities for our local children and youth in recognition of the value of arts in education and their life affirming attributes
- To employ local artists by offering grants for public art proposals and arts classes, and artists-in-residence programs
- To regularly refresh our board of directors with business-minded community leaders who properly reflect the diverse demographics of the Yuba-Sutter Area and add value to our core mission
- To foster partnerships with other arts organizations to share resources and build audiences
- To meet annual fundraising targets through public and private, corporate, and individual, sponsorships – to back both strong programming and core operations
- To expand our outreach by participating in fairs and festivals that include interactive activities for children, adults and seniors

Governance

Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture is governed by its Board of Directors and Officers, who are elected annually from its membership. Meeting monthly, our Board plays an active role in governing, supporting, and advocating for us. In addition to its elected officials, the Board consists of one representative for each of the following local governments: Yuba County, Sutter County, the City of Marysville, the City of Live Oak, and the City of Yuba City. Members of the Board also represent local artists, skilled business professionals, and the cultural diversity of the region.



Arts in Education Coordinator / Social Media Manager



Programs and Resources

Lee Burrows Center for the Arts

Our Burrows Theater was closed due to COVID for most of 2019-2020. We did host “Applause: Home for the Holidays,” a sold-out comedy night show, and a Yuba Sutter Youth Choir series of performances, but we were forced to close in March of 2020. This was a difficult time as we are used to a very busy schedule with both our own productions, and we work with other community performing arts organizations and schools on a regular basis.

Our Gallery and Offices:

During the fall of 2019 and early 2020, we hosted eight different gallery shows including a Veterans art exhibit and an emerging artists show. In mid-March 2020,

we were required to shutter our gallery right after we had finished hanging the Yuba City High School art exhibition, so the opening reception had to be cancelled. We are scheduled to re-open in the fall of 2021. Our theater and gallery are 100% ADA accessible, including the kitchen area, which is outfitted with lowered light switches and wide access doors.

Sutter Theater Center for the Arts Clark Family Black Box Theater:

Thanks to a generous gift from the Sutter Performing Arts Association, Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture now owns the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts on Plumas Street in the heart of Yuba City. We are programming events like “Art Fix – Burning Man,” “ARTrium Vibes” concerts and weekly dance lessons and social dances including West Coast Swing, Salsa, and Ballroom.

Theater Gallery:

The Theater Art Gallery has been open for years even during the theater remodel and has helped generate significant revenue for the restoration project. In late 2021, five local artists will take up residency to again display their work with regular appearances by guest artists.

Programs and Services

During 2019-2021 we adapted to the newly mandated virtual environment continuing our marquis programs and inventing new forms of arts engagement.

Applause & Applause Kids!

Initially begun as a musical series to help fund the creation of the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts, these Broadway style cabaret shows continue as highly popular theater experiences for both adult and youth performers much to the delight of the community.

Art Everywhere

A signature program of Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture, we work with venues to create small-scale galleries in traditional and nontraditional spaces such as offices, government buildings, restaurants and retail locations, each of which host two to four artists’ shows each year. Sharing art and exposure for our artists is key to our belief in Art Everywhere!

Arts Exposure

This grant funded program allowed us to take a group of high school student to Los Angeles just before the pandemic to tour the Getty Villa and Getty Center. During the height of the COVID outbreak, we went virtual with live docent led tours of the Crocker Museum and the DeYoung Museum.

Arts in Correction

Our arts education programs in the two County jails were suspended due to COVID.

Art Mentorship Program

Our CAC funded arts mentorship program helped us develop not just artists, but also local arts advocates and arts leaders to help champion the arts at all levels in Yuba-Sutter. Our professional artist mentor guided eight local emerging artists at various stages of their careers with a series of virtual meetings, online Zoom public conversations and finally two live gallery exhibitions.

Consultation

Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture provides consultation to local organizations and government agencies in implementing new arts programs. We also provide one-to-one support to artists with professional needs such as developing bios, statements, and concepts for their work to propose to professional galleries and institutions. Research for grants for individuals and artist residencies are also provided as needed

Murals of Live Oak (MOLO)

Beginning in 2016, we secured a pledge of matched funds from the City of Live Oak for the commissioning of 2-3 exterior wall murals per year. This is an exciting project driven by economic development and community pride and as of 2021, 20 murals have been completed.

Poetry Out Loud

Our longstanding Poetry Out Loud program continued through the pandemic although with somewhat reduced participation. By making virtual classroom visits we still came away with a group of students we helped master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about their literary heritage.

Scholastic Writing Awards

As the local seven county Northern California affiliate for the Scholastic Writing program, we were pleased to see the participation actually increased during the pandemic. We received more entries in each category from more schools than ever before in our three year history with the program. We held a virtual award ceremony and recognized the winners.

Veterans Initiative in the Arts

Our most recent Veterans programs include "Sleeping Giants: Pearl Harbor Survivors Then and Now" and a Veterans Pop Up virtual Arts Café in collaboration with VetArt in San Diego.

Very Special Arts (VSA)

Although on hold in 2020 and 2021, most years Yuba Sutter Arts and Culture hosts approximately 500 special needs students and their families from both counties for a festival of arts and performances.

Yuba Sutter Youth Choir & Applause Kids!

Both of these youth performing arts programs were casualties of the pandemic in terms of live rehearsal and performances. However, Applause Kids! did create three virtual musicals including "Super Happy Awesome News," "Should you Hug A Cactus," and a holiday show.

Womanikins

We did hold a live outdoor event in August of 2020 in recognition of the 100th anniversary of the enactment of the 19th amendment. Called "Womanikins," over 30 individual artists and local organizations using identical torso shells, created individual art works using a variety of materials to embellish and add social messaging to the torsos. The finished pieces were all part of a well-attended outdoor art gallery display in the front of the historic Teegarden House in Yuba City.

Virtual Programs Inspired by the Pandemic

The pandemic inspired the following new arts ventures, some monthly and some special productions. These are shown either live or pre-recorded and posted later

Ongoing Monthly Virtual Programs

All About the Arts – Three hosts talk about local arts events and interview special guests involved in the local arts community.

Artist's Alchemy – A one on one interview program hosted by Executive Director David Read talking with mostly local creatives with the occasional guest from around the country.

Solo Sessions – Our Musician in Residence, Tom Galvin, invites singer songwriters from around the country to share their music and insights about the art of songwriting.

Poetry Square – Local Poet, Diane Funston, invites three poets to join her each month for conversation and readings of their work.

Notes from the Field – Yuba-Sutter Poet Laureate and acclaimed poet and memoirist, Marcelo Hernandez Castillo, interviews poetry colleagues from all around the country about their inspiration and their work.

Special One Time Virtual Events

Community leaders and others participated in various virtual projects including a reading of *The Night Before Christmas*, *Loving Out Loud*, a special Valentine's Day program with community members reading their favorite love poems, April Poetry Month readings, and Community Conversations discussing subjects like "the importance and value of public art and publicly funded arts programs. Additional virtual events included a full production of "Songs for A New World," A Pop Up Veterans' Art Café and listening session, a "Slightly Batty" Halloween Event, and a reading of "The Night Before Christmas" by local community leaders..
