Once upon a time

Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture was the inspiration of a devoted artist and arts leader, Lee Burrows. Lee's labor of love – what would become one of the highest-ranking regional arts councils in California – began in a small office beneath the stairs of City Hall in Marysville back in 1981. In the mid-90s, along with a handful of local artists and business owners, Lee purchased an old church with a stage, a courtyard and garden, two small offices, and a meeting room on E Street in Marysville. E Street is known now as Marysville's "gateway." Lee's old church, with its garden and its recently refurbished offices is now the Lee Burrows Center for the Arts at Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture.

Where we are

The Yuba-Sutter Area rests in the Central Valley of California, north of the state capital of Sacramento, and banks the east and west sides of the Feather River which separates them. Yuba County lies along the western slope of the Sierra Nevada, while Sutter County flanks the Sacramento River in the Sacramento Valley and is home to the Sutter Buttes "the world's smallest mountain range."

YSAC Fact

The California Arts Council's mission is to strengthen arts, culture, and creative expression as the tools to cultivate a better California for all.

Their vision is to provide a California where all people flourish with universal access to and opportunities for participation in the arts.



While agricultural life dominates our area, the Arts are a significant focal point for the future economic development of the region, particularly through their engagement in otherwise underserved rural areas and in partnership with both counties through an emerging public art strategy and increased programming. Home to about 180,000, Yuba-Sutter enjoys great cultural diversity with Latinx/e, Asian, BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) and LGBTQIA+ populations.

What we do

Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture provides arts programming and advocacy for the bi-county Yuba-Sutter Area. Our mission is to enrich the quality of life of our residents through participation and effective arts development. We host exhibitions, workshops, musical programs, theater productions, literary events and lectures, along with a wide variety of community functions on behalf of the artists and arts organizations we support. Off-site we run diverse outreach and education programs that penetrate deep into our underserved areas.

Our Strategic priorities

- To build sustainable and equitable arts programs which create impact and meaning
- To provide opportunities for our local children and youth in recognition of the value of arts in education and their life affirming attributes
- To regularly refresh our board of directors with business-minded community leaders who properly reflect the diverse demographics of the Yuba-Sutter Area and add value to our core mission
- To foster partnerships with other arts organizations to share resources and to build audiences
- To employ local artists by offering grants for public art proposals and arts classes, and artists-in-residence programs
- To meet annual fundraising targets through public and private, corporate, and individual, sponsorships to back both strong programming and core operations
- To expand our outreach by participating in fairs and festivals that include interactive activities for children, adults and seniors

Governance

Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture is governed by its Board of Directors and Officers, who are elected annually from its membership. Meeting monthly, our Board plays an active role in governing, supporting, and advocating for us. In addition to its elected officials, the Board consists of one representative for each of the following local governments: Yuba County, Sutter County, the City of Marysville, the City of Live Oak, and the City of Yuba City. Members of the Board also represent local artists, skilled business professionals, and the cultural diversity of the region.











Susan has lived in the Yuba Sutter area for over 25 years and most recently served as Co-chair of the Sutter Performing Arts Association. Professionally, Susan was a teacher, principal, and Cabinet Level Administrator for Sacramento City Unified School District. Dan Flores



Shawntay Arroyo | Arts in Education Coordinator/Social Media Manager



















Resources, Programs and Services

Lee Burrows Center for the Arts

Programs and events are slowly returning to our Marysville campus. In our Burrows Art Gallery, we have hosted several student art shows for the YES Charter Academy (Yuba Environmental Science), Yuba City High School and the Marysville Charter Academy for the Arts. We also host weekly meetings of the Yuba-Sutter Improv Club including live performances. Our Center Courtyard is also the home of our "Umbrella Sky" art installation which provides a lovely shade cover for courtyard concerts. The Lee Burrows Center for the Arts remains the headquarters office for Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture.



Sutter Theater Center for the Arts

The Sutter Theater Center for the Arts includes the Clark Family Black Box Theater, the still to be developed Main Stage (Phase II), and the Art Box Theater Gallery. Thanks to a generous gift from the Sutter Performing Arts Association Board of Directors, Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture acquired the property on Plumas Street in the heart of Yuba City in 2021. We have held countless events in the theater since its acquisition including live music and theater performances, youth performing arts programs, dance lessons, and movie screenings including The Rocky Horror Picture Show. The space is also available for private rentals. There is an entire back half of the theater waiting to be remodeled and opened as a 299-seat proscenium arch stage performing arts space. The expanded seating will enable us to bring in bigger name outside acts and monetize the cost across more seats, but still at an affordable ticket price. Our Art Box Theater Art Gallery has been open for years even during the theater remodel and has helped generate significant revenue for the restoration project. Currently, three local artists display their work with regular monthly appearances by guest artists.



YSAC Fact

Pablo Picasso, likened his paintings to maintaining a diary. The way he describes substituting a paintbrush for a pen demonstrates how similar the branches of the arts can be. It's not so much about being a painter or a writer; they are two beasts of the same species. We could also guess that creativity of all types essentially draws from the same well of genius.



Kalakara Artist Studio Complex

Kalakara means "artist" in Punjabi. Located in Yuba City, we have units that are work spaces for artists including the Paint Palette Studio where after school art classes are offered for 7-14 year olds.



Arts Exposure

We were able to renew this grant funded program which allowed us to take groups of high school students to the DeYoung Museum and the Museum of Modern Art in San Francisco, and the Van Gogh Experience, and Crocker Museum in Sacramento. We have also funded trips to live Broadway productions and field trips to music festivals.

Center Stage Productions

In early 2022, we formed a state-of-the-art youth performing arts program called Center Stage Productions led by local professional teaching artists, Corey and Morgan Kersting. In addition to regular workshops that cover acting, choreography, and auditioning, the first two productions, "Seize the Day," and "Seussical" have been wildly successful on all levels.

Consultation

Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture provides consultation to local organizations and government agencies in implementing new public arts programs. For example, Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture & Culture has mentored Tri-County Diversity in many ways over the years. We also provide one-to-one support to artists with professional needs such as developing bios, statements, and concepts for their work to propose to professional galleries and institutions. Research for grants for individuals and artist residencies are also provided as needed.

YSAC Fact

The breadth of programs and events created by YSAC continues to grow as witnessed by the new youth mariachi youth orchestra program begun in collaboration with the Marysville Joint Unified School District and the Alliance for Hispanic Advancement.



Convergence Theatre Company

Convergence is our new community theater program. It's mission is to create productions of timely and thought-provoking plays that go beyond simple entertainment. The inaugural season included "Roe," "Godspell," and "The Laramie Project," all of which opened to great acclaim.

Fiscal Sponsorships

Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture is pleased to be able to provide financial management and fiscal sponsorship services for organizations that lack full non-profit status. Currently, these include the Undocupoets, the Yuba County Historic Resources Commission, and the company creating a stage adaptation of the film "Salt of the Earth."

Jump StArts Grant Program

Now in our third round of funding, Jump StArts is designed to provide hands on art experiences for at risk, system engaged youth. We work with continuation schools including Feather River Academy, Albert Powell, T.E. Mathews and Camp Singer Youth Guidance Center. Programs include music, poetry, and visual arts in addition to live, on site performances by guest artists.

Murals of Live Oak (MOLO)

Beginning in 2016, we secured a pledge of matched funds from the City of Live Oak for the commissioning of 2-3 exterior wall murals per year. This is an exciting project driven by economic development and community pride and as of 2021, 20 murals have been completed.









Outdoor Equity Program

Thanks to a generous grant from the California Department of Parks & Recreation, YSAC is able to host monthly outings to local scenic locations including the Sutter Buttes, Table Mountain, and the Truckee/Donner Pass area. The trips are led by professional science teachers and naturalists along with a teaching artist who leads nature journaling and sketching sessions. Transportation, art supplies and snacks are provided free of charge.

Poetry Out Loud

Our longstanding Poetry Out Loud program is back to live participation by high school students who commit to memorizing and reciting poems in front of an audience. Students master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about their literary heritage. Following a public competition each year, a champion from each county is chosen to attend the state finals.







Reel Book Society

The Reel Book Society is a new and improved version of the traditional book club. In Society, participants read a book and then watch a film adaptation of that book to discuss as a group. The Reel Book Society blends book and film analysis to interact with familiar forms of entertainment and media in an engaging way. Books and films read, viewed, and discussed have included everything from "The Princess Diaries" to "Hunger Games."

Regranting Grants

The pandemic resulted in CARES Act funding and additional funding through the National Endowment for the Arts enabling us to provide grants to local artists and arts organizations. To date, we regranted over \$200,000 to groups including the Yuba-Sutter Master Chorale, the Yuba Sutter Oratorio Society, and the Alliance for Hispanic Advancement.

Scholastic Writing Awards

As the Scholastic Art & Writing Award program Northern California affiliate for seven counties, we are pleased to see the increased participation these past two years. We received more entries in each category from more schools than ever before in our five year history with the program. The award ceremonies are back to live events and are attended by students, families and friend in record numbers.

Upstate California Creative Corps

Yuba Sutter Arts & Culture & Culture was honored to be included as a committee member for California's Upstate Region on this new workforce development opportunity for artists, cultural practitioners and arts, and social service sector organizations. It is designed to include and compensate artists and arts organizations to fund projects to increase awareness related to issues such as public health, water and energy conservation, climate mitigation, and emergency preparedness, relief, and recovery. The program resulted in nearly \$250,000 going to our local artists and arts and culture organizations.

Very Special Arts

This long running program for special needs students and their families from both counties is returning following a COVID-induced pause. It is a series of classroom projects leading up to a one day live festival of arts and performances with activities for a variety of skill levels.

Youth Mariachi Program

In collaboration with the Alliance for Hispanic Advancement and the Marysville Joint Unified School District, YSAC was able to institute an after school youth mariachi training program at two middle schools; Yuba Gardens and Arboga School. Start up funds were raised by holding mariachi concerts and applying for grants in order to purchase instruments and provide supplemental stipends for District instructors in the hopes that future funding can be secured to continue the program.


Yuba-Sutter Big Band Orchestra

Founded in 2021 by local professional musicians and music educators, the Yuba Sutter Big Band concerts have quickly become one of the hottest tickets in town. Based at the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts, the ensemble's repertoire runs the gamut from the Great American Songbook to big band style covers of current pop tunes.

Yuba-Sutter Improv Club


