Marysville Charter Academy for the Arts Student Art Showcase Free Opening Reception on March 29th

This is the next in a series of Spring student art exhibitions. The MCAA student visual art show will be in the Art Box Gallery located at the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts. The gala opening reception with refreshments will be held on Saturday, March 29 from 12-4 pm. The art show is being curated by art department faculty including Glen Weisgerber and Edi Fogel. The Sutter Theater Center for the Arts is located at 754 Plumas Street in Yuba City.

Several of the visual art pieces that will be on display were featured recently at the annual Scholastic Art & Writing Awards event at the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts. MCAA students received high honors in this national recognition program for achievement in both the visual and literary arts. It is likely that many of these will also be submitted to the upcoming Congressional Art Competition. If you missed the Scholastic award ceremony, this exhibition would provide an opportunity to see the work alongside other pieces created by the many talented young artists in our community.
