It celebrates the creativity of neighbors and highlights the cultural richness that exists within our region. By keeping arts opportunities close to home, residents of all ages can participate without the barriers of long distances or high costs. For the artists, this showcase provides crucial visibility, potential income, and the confidence that their work is valued locally. For audiences, it offers inspiration, beauty, and a shared sense of identity. These monthly exhibits also help stimulate local commerce by drawing people to nearby shops and restaurants, adding economic vitality to the season. Ultimately, a rural holiday art exhibit strengthens relationships, nurtures emerging talent, and brings joy to the community at a moment when collective celebration matters most.

The reception will also celebrate the work of three Gallery Anchor Artists. Emily Cordi loves to create from recycled and foraged materials. She is inspired by the wildlife, nature, agriculture, and countryside of the Sutter Buttes near her family's winery. Laurie Trent-Butsch creates jewelry from vintage china, and she also works with vintage silverware. She discovered a passion for working with unwanted, neglected silverware, bringing these pieces back to life as beautiful, wearable pieces of art that can convey stories of family and love.
