Mark your calendars for the opening reception on Friday, May 1 from 4:30 – 6:30pm at the Sutter Theater Center for the Arts, 754 Plumas Street. Yuba City. The artists will talk about their work, how they got started and what inspires them to keep creating. Normal hours for the showcase are Wednesday through Saturday from 11 am to 4 pm. The Marketplace is also open during special events in the theater.
